

Main Lesson Bookwork:

- 1. Write in the dictation from yesterday as a good copy in your Main Lesson Books, in the border you created yesterday
- 2. In your 64 page draft books, write an acrostic poem about a dandelion. A reminder, an acrostic poem is where you use the letters of the word to begin a word or sentence. As an example, if I were to write one about spring, I could say:





And you can EITHER use these letters to begin a sentence as I have in the poem Spring, OR you can use these letters to write a word that describes the dandelion.

3. Prepare your Dandelion page, with a border and picture of the 3 stages of a dandelion's life – leaf, flower and fruit (the white seeds you make a wish with as you blow).

Notice the interesting petal formation, like sun rays, raying from a golden centre to a yellow outer





Look at the sharp teeth- like leaves, this is why the dandelion is called so, because it comes from the French 'dent de lions' meaning lion's teeth
